Today MCCIP is launching its first Marine Climate Smart Working Report Card.

The British Marine Federation (BMF) is the first trade association to take part in a new initiative on climate change risks and opportunities. This work, led by the Marine Climate Change Impacts Partnership (MCCIP) and in partnership with the Environment Agency's "Climate Ready" support service, has identified specific threats and opportunities for the UK marine leisure industry. As a result of this work, a 12-page guidance document 'Climate Change and UK Marine Leisure Industry: Adapting to a Changing World' has now been published. This guide summarises for the first time how climate change could affect this important part of the UK economy. It provides a step-by-step guide to help users understand the physical impacts from climate change, and explores what individual, and collective responses may be needed.

The online version of this document includes an interactive 2-page workspace, allowing individuals to explore threats and opportunities to their own business and start to consider adaptation actions. Your responses can be saved to provide a record of climate change threats and opportunities as part of your business planning. With input from its members, BMF are looking to set up a database of risks and opportunities to provide a shared learning resource. The publication is also available in hard copy and as an e-publication.
